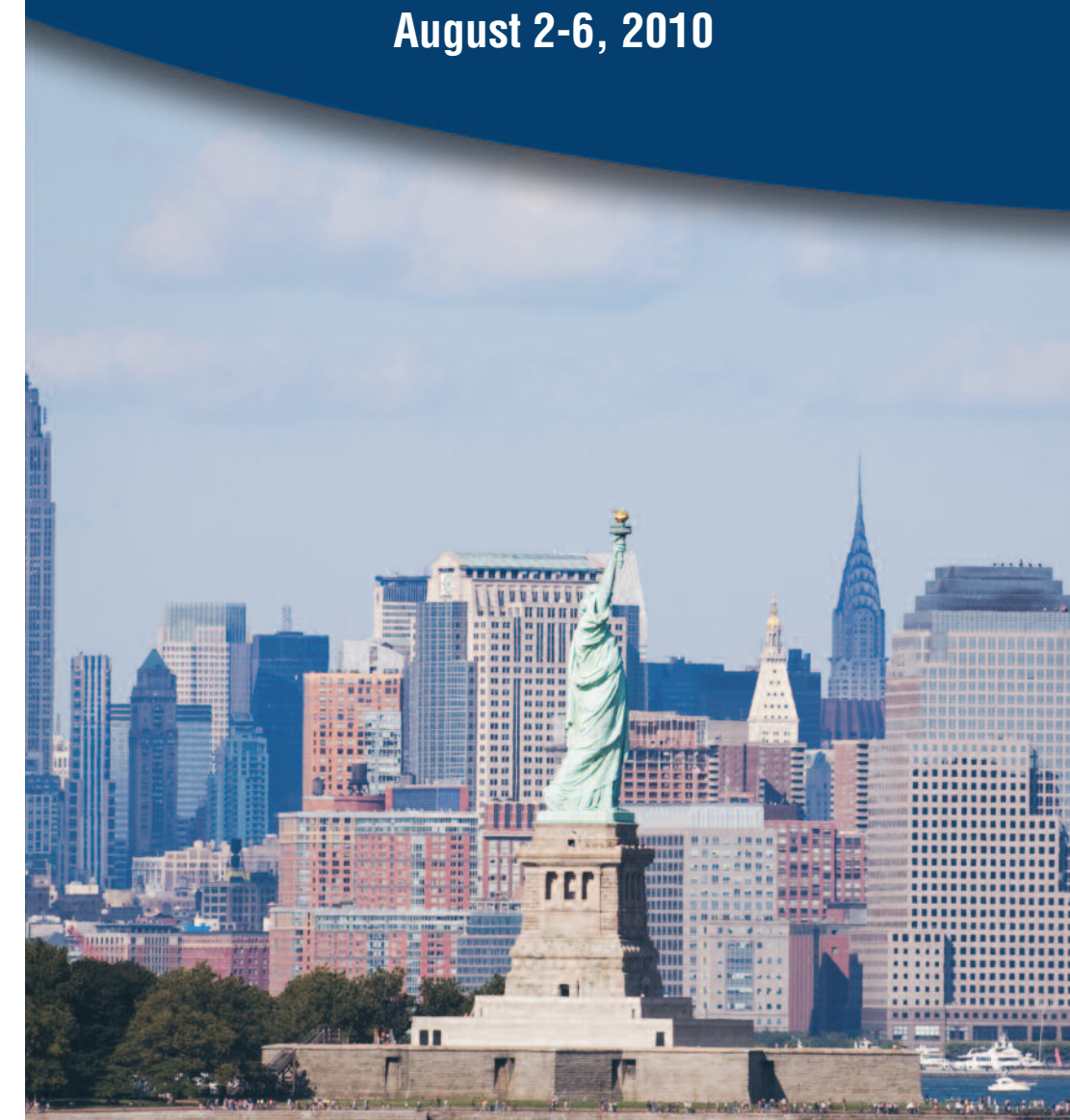

## Course Description

### Implant Treatment in the Aesthetic Zone

Monday, August 2, 2010 - 9:00 a.m. – 4:00 p.m. - Michael Sonick, DMD

Implant dentistry is now part of routine dental treatment. It is no longer enough for an implant to merely osseointegrate; it must be aesthetic as well. The maxillary anterior dental implant is perhaps the most challenging for the clinician. A multiplicity of techniques must be mastered including, but not limited to, implant placement, proper surgical technique, bone augmentation, soft tissue development and proper restoration.

### Bone Grafting and Tissue Management for the Implant Platform: The Success and Failures; How to Avoid the Unexpected Result

Implant therapy has become a major portion of dental treatment. Bone grafting and associated therapies are integral to the success of the implant fixture. Whether the implant is placed in the anterior or posterior part of the dental arch, proper tissue environment is crucial to success. Failures in this area of treatment are now commonplace and need to be addressed as to the cause and solution. New technologies are now part of the solution and may reduce many of these complications.

### Aesthetics, Implants and Occlusion Using Computerized Dentistry for Private Practice

Over the past 10 years there have been many advances in dentistry that have helped our practices and our patients. Delivering excellent restorations using computerized techniques can make it easier and more predictable. A step-by-step approach to treatment planning, provisionals and final restorations will be described. Long term implant restorations require provisionals that can maintain and preserve the dentition during the healing phase.

### New Treatment Protocols for Challenging Clinical Situations: Management of Infected Sites, Immediate Loading of Fully and Partially Edentulous Cases Including Biomechanical and Aesthetic Considerations and Immediate Molar Placement.

Thursday, August 5, 2010 - 9:00 a.m. – 4:00 p.m. - Alan Meltzer, DDS, MScD

An understanding of wound healing, bone biology and aesthetics is necessary to produce superior outcomes utilizing accelerated treatment protocols. Advanced treatment pathways with detailed clinical guidelines will be presented. Immediate tooth replacement, infected site management as well as strategies for management of immediate implants within the aesthetic zone will be discussed. Additional information on CT Guidance for minimally invasive surgery and immediate restorations will also be presented.

### Young Patients and Aesthetic Single Implant Outcomes

Friday, August 6, 2010 - 9:00 a.m. – 3:00 p.m. - George Priest, DMD

Young adults represent a large and growing segment of potential implant patients. The majority of young patients are seeking implant care in the aesthetic zone primarily due to congenital absence and trauma. With proper treatment planning and collaboration between members of the implant team, young patients can avoid the ravages of conventional dental procedures and ensure long term functional and aesthetic success. This presentation includes guidelines for treating young patients with implants including appropriate age and maturity, cost and value of implant treatment; the essential role of the orthodontist in site preparation; developing soft-tissue profiles; immediate placement and provisional restorations; and clinical examples and data highlighting long term results.
